GENEALOGY/BIOGRAPHY Anderson Papers on Dr. Douglas E. Butman

SCOPE and CONTENT

This collection consists of various items pertaining to the World War II service of Dr. Douglas E. Butman, a beloved physician who spent his career in Waltham. The papers were donated by Ross Elliott, who was the grandson of Richard S. Anderson. Mr. Anderson was a Medical Officer attached to the Seabees and served with Dr. Butman.

Included are:

- 1) A WORD document transcript entitled "New York to Normandy" originally written by Richard S. Anderson. It discusses the time leading up to the Normandy invasion. Those pages specifically mentioning Dr. Butman are 29-31, 34, 42, 62, 78-79, 83, and 88-92.
- 2) A memoir of Patricia Farley entitled "Birds of a Feather." She was a Royal Navy Wren stationed at Rosneath, Scotland, when Dr. Butman was there.
- 3) WORD document transcript of sixteen typed pages which were a recomposition of the handwritten entries in Mr. Anderson's war diary.
- 4) JPEG images covering four handwritten pages from the diary.
- 5) ZIP document of a typed edit of one (last?) page of the diary, followed by images of seven handwritten pages of the diary.

These all provide detailed, first-hand accounts of Dr. Butman's war service. They are especially valuable since the "Doctor Douglas Butman Collection" does not have any personal material relating to his war period.
