Items are arranged in subseries by hospital. The series comprises approximately 4.6 linear feet of space.

Scope and Content Note

This series includes information on the following hospitals and Medical facilities: Deaconess Waltham Hospital, Hospice West Inc., Leland Home, Metropolitan State Hospital, Middlesex County Hospital, Murphy Army Hospital, Walter E. Fernald School, Waltham Baby Hospital and Waltham Hospital (now Waltham Weston Hospital.)

Histories of the Deaconess Waltham, Middlesex County, Murphy Army, Walter E. Fernald and Waltham Weston Hospitals are included here. Also in this series are annual reports for Met State, The Fernald School, Waltham Baby Hospital and Waltham Hospital. Early records pertaining to a hospital's founding (with histories, rules and by-laws and financing) are included for the Leland Home, Waltham Baby Hospital and Waltham Hospital. Some brochures for Hospice West are also in this series.

Metropolitan State Hospital and the Walter E. Fernald School are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Copies of their applications are found in this series.

The Waltham Hospital makes up the bulk of the series with 3 boxes of Annual reports dating from 1889--1978. Historical, Planning, and financing information take up another .7 linear feet.
